- Step 1: Print this A4 document at 100% size (don't scale it down). Use double-sided printing if you can, otherwise print both pages and glue them together.
- Step 2: Cut out the flyer using the black border as a guide.
- **Step 3:** With the cover image (the two hands) facing you, and the text the right way up, fold the flyer in half (with the top half folding away from you), so you end up with a long thin piece of folded paper.






Step 4: Flip the document horizontally so that the black & white photo of the girl is facing you and is on the left-hand side.

**Step 5:** The document now needs to be folded into threes. Fold the right-hand side of the document ("Useful Websites") to the left, so that it lines up with the edge of the black & white photo of the girl. Keep the document folded up this way for the next step.

**Step 6:** Fold the cover (with the image of the two hands) to the right so that it covers the rest of the document.







## What you need to know

- Advances in medication means HIV is now a manageable condition.
- You are not able to get HIV from anyone who is on effective HIV treatment.
- People living with HIV who are on effective HIV treatment, have the same life expectancy as anyone else.



## I can't pass HIV on to anyone

- No one can get HIV from me by hugging, kissing, sharing food or toilet seats.
- I am on effective treatment which means the HIV virus is at an undetectable level in my body. It has been scientifically proven that when the virus is undetectable in a person, they are unable to sexually transmit HIV, even when not using a condom.
